Dear Minister

On behalf of the Board of the Charitable and Social Welfare Fund (Community Benefit SA), I am very pleased to present the Annual Report for the financial year 2012-13.

The Board met 11 times including in July, September, November, February and April to consider applications. This year is the first full year of operation since the fund was reviewed in 2011 and 2012. The review has streamlined operations in the areas of applications, assessment and notification. Applicants are now being notified within 16 weeks rather than 20. Funds distribution is occurring at least four times per year instead of two. The Board is encouraged by the positive outcomes.

The program did not advertise in the mainstream media in 2012/13, opting instead to use the community service networks to disseminate information. Staff of the program offered a telephone support service to applicants in favour of a community based information session. The lack of advertising and lower community profile has resulted in the fund receiving fewer applications than anticipated.

In 2012/13 the Board considered 373 applications for grants requesting more than \$7m. The Board approved 165 one-off projects valued at \$2,614,596 to non-government organisations delivering community services in South Australia. Project summaries are provided for you at the end of this report.

It is pleasing to see the range of organisations continuing to access this fund to improve the wellbeing of their communities. The Board still has a challenge to improve the quality of applications that are submitted to the fund.

The Board developed a new program this year and submitted it to you for your approval. The Special Community Youth Grants program will provide one-off grants to established services that support families with children and young people who have been or who may be at risk of having contact with the youth justice system. The guidelines were approved by you in April 2013 and applications closed in July 2013. The results of the program will be published in next years Annual Report.

The Special Community Youth Grants will provide Community Benefit SA with an opportunity to improve how success is measured by adopting a results-based accountability framework.

The Board was pleased to support the Homelessness Strategy Division of the Department for Communities and Social Inclusion again this year in the final year of the Homelessness Innovation Fund. A total of \$100,000 was allocated among five projects, with the funds made available through the National Agreement for Housing Affordability. Project summaries are

provided at the end of this report.

The staff team also provided support to the Dame Roma Mitchell Trust Fund for Children and Young People and assisted its smooth transition to the Department for Education and Child Development. The team also supported the Multicultural Grants in exploring online applications, assessed the applications for the Office for Youth's youthconnect program and provided expertise to a variety of other grant panels in South Australia including the Premier's Community Initiatives Fund, Aboriginal Health Grants, Parenting SA and Youth Network Grants.

Partnerships, innovation and enterprise have again been encouraged as a strategy to maximise use of existing community resources. An ongoing trend is the high level of initiative of applicants in responding to unmet need in the community. The Board is continually impressed with the practical and well developed proposals from organisations that provide valuable services to the most vulnerable people in SA, despite scarce resources.

There is also continuing high demand for upgrading community facilities in both rural and metropolitan areas as well as the ever-expanding need for improved technology. Last year, the program offered small equipment grants up to \$10,000 and this year, after the successful pilot of the online application system, the Board released guidelines to also include programs and services, facility projects and strategic improvements up to \$45,000.

I wish to thank the Board for their expertise and commitment to the South Australian community. The hard-working staff team are also to be commended for conducting the review of the Community Benefit SA grants program this year and implementing recommendations alongside the many complex tasks associated with the successful operation of a grants program.

I commend this report to you on another extraordinary year of service by the Board and staff of Community Benefit SA for South Australian community organisations.

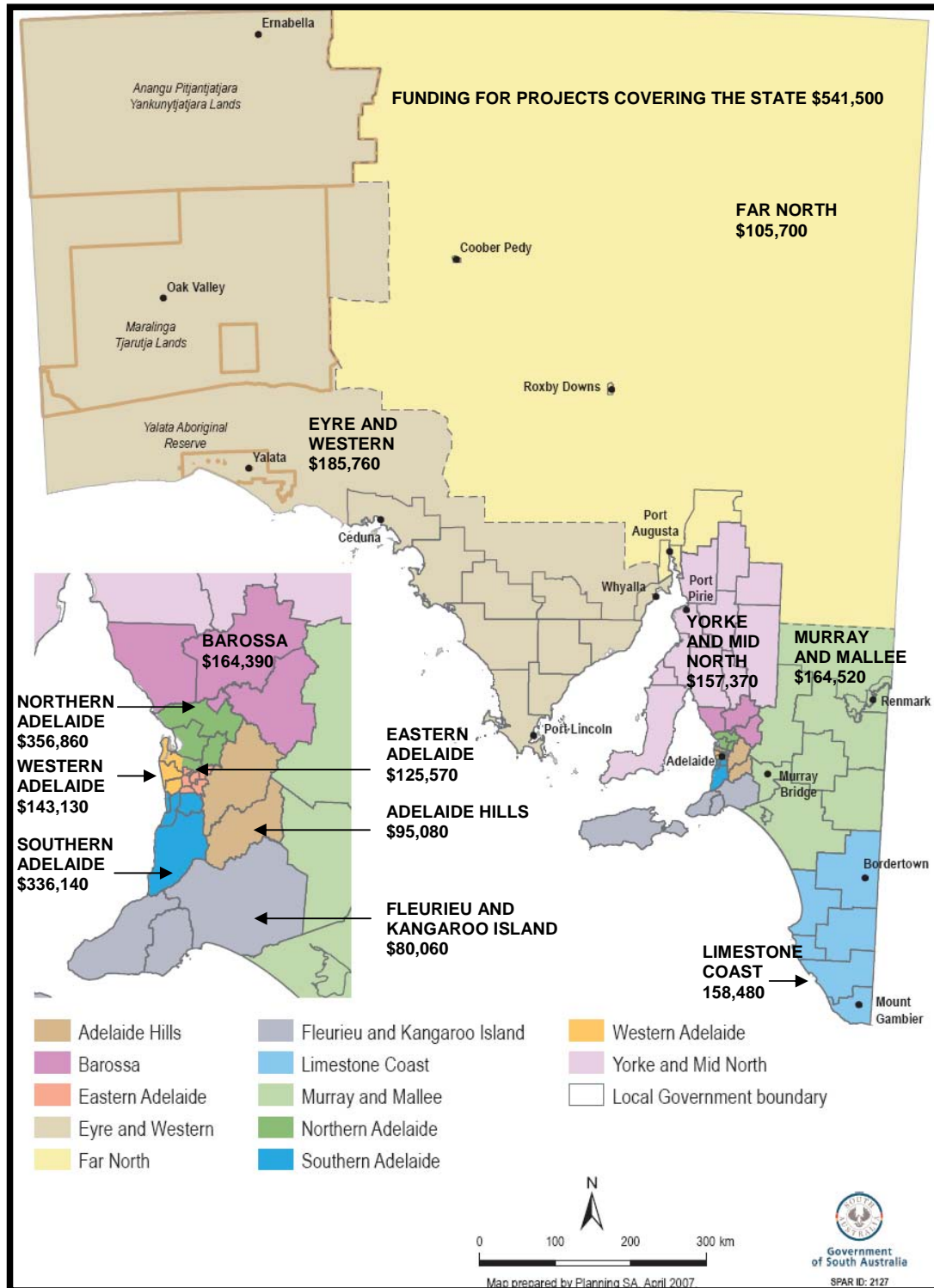

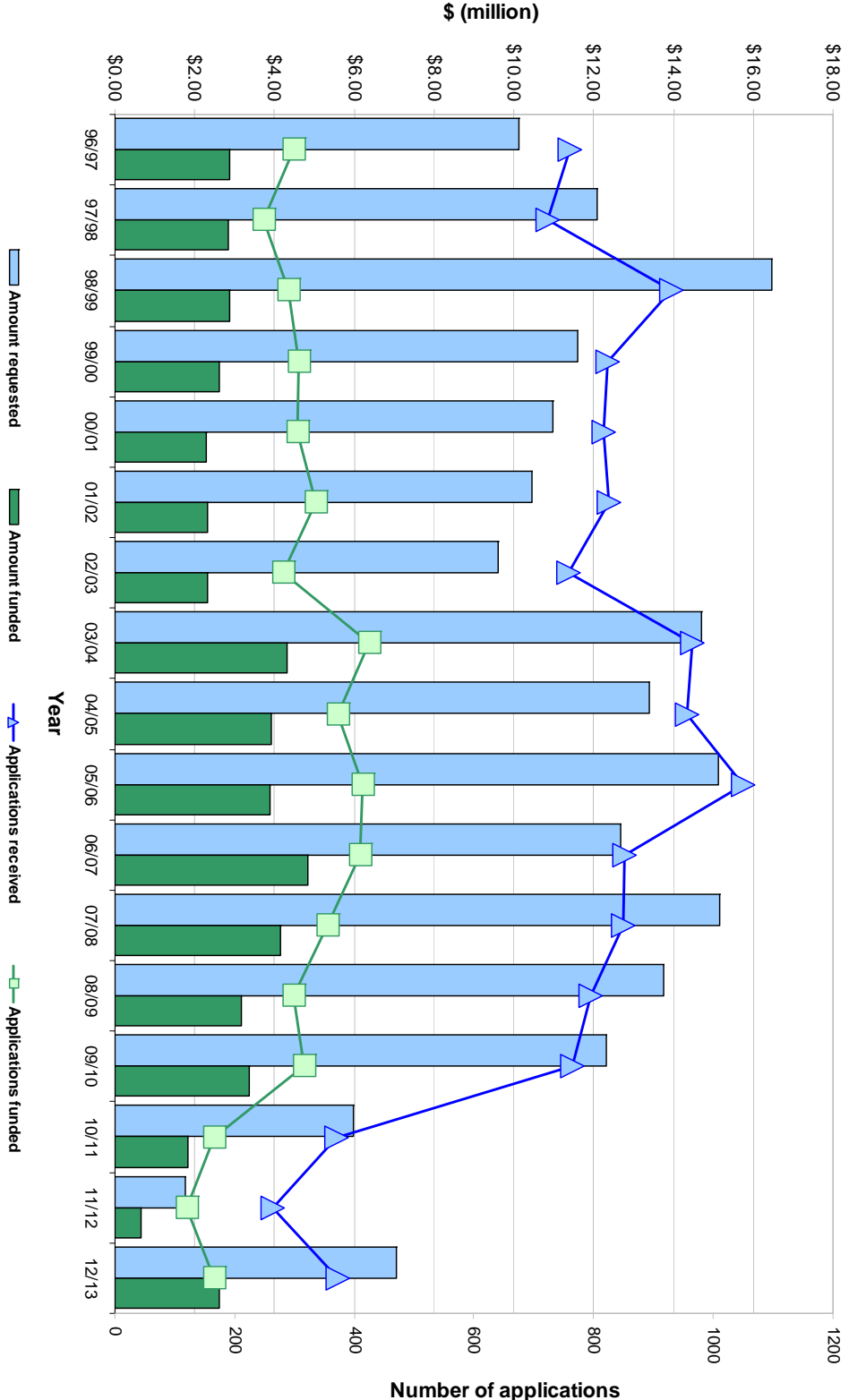

Summary of Applications and Project History



Accountability statement

Evaluation reports contain essential information detailing the outcomes for disadvantaged individuals, families and communities. The financial certificate provides a declaration by the organisations that funds have been expended in accordance with the approved contract. From time to time the Board will seek further reports or gather information through different methods; including telephone interviews or agency visits.

Feedback from funded organisations suggests that the accountability requirements for project grants are proportionate. The Board is satisfied with the standard of evaluation and acquittal being provided by grant recipients.

Formal assessments have been conducted of 4,112 out of the 5,103 one-off projects funded. Evaluation reports are given a rating out of 5 and are recorded for quality.

Higher quality results (score of 4 or 5)

1,183 projects (or 29%) were rated as having higher quality outcomes than expected. This includes value added outcomes like donations from local business, work done by volunteers, one-off project becomes ongoing, the applicant develops more services, higher numbers participated than expected or people have transformed their lives in a significant way.

Expected results (score of 3)

The intended objectives of the grant were met for 2,133 projects (or 51%). This means the funds were spent in accordance with the grant agreement, the target people who were in need received a benefit from the grant.

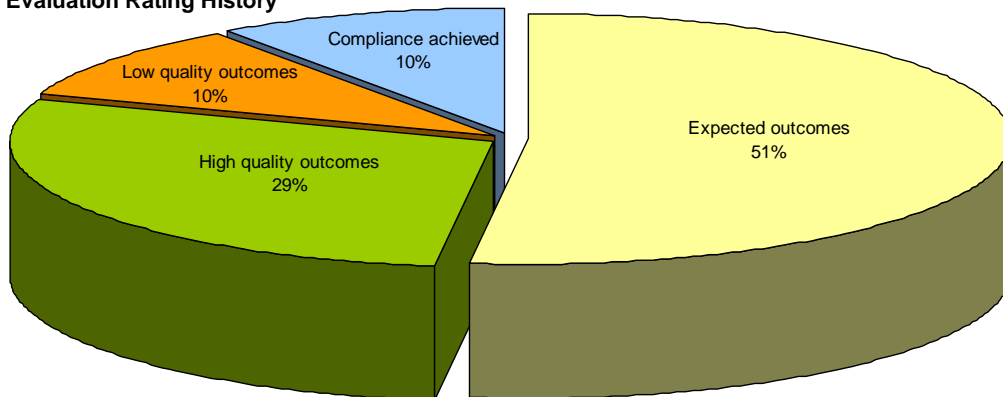
Lower quality results (score of 1 or 2)

Only 396 projects (11%) had lower quality outcomes than expected. This means the project was carried out but the objectives were only partially met. The outcomes were of a lower quality than expected, the number of participants was lower than planned, people's needs were met but only to a limited degree or the project was not implemented as planned.

Compliance achieved (unrated)

Strict adherence to the requirements has been waived for 400 reports representing about 10% of the reports received since 1997 in accordance with a policy of the Board. This includes where there is sufficient evidence to suggest that the project occurred but reports are unsatisfactory and are not able to be improved with support from CBSA staff.

Financial Statement

Statement by the Board of the Charitable and Social Welfare Fund

The Fund was established under section 73B of the *Gaming Machines Act 1992* and was developed in response to the impact of the introduction of gaming machines in hotels and social clubs in South Australia. The Fund was established to enhance the level of community support through the metropolitan, regional and rural areas of South Australia by providing financial assistance to community organisations addressing social welfare needs, including those organisations experiencing increased service demands relating to gaming machine use, with special emphasis on:

- The most vulnerable individuals, families and communities who are suffering poverty or hardship and risk breakdown,
- New ways of increasing financial support for organisations which are in the transition from reliance upon gambling related fundraising methods.

During the year ended 30 June 2013, funding totalling \$4,000,000 was received and grants totalling \$2,502,426 were paid to organisations meeting established criteria. This figure includes the payment of several grants approved in 2011/12.

In accordance with a resolution of the Board of the above Fund we confirm that the attached financial statements, prepared the Department of Treasury and Finance and the Department for Communities and Social Inclusion, reflects the results and operations of the Fund for the year ending 30 June 2013.



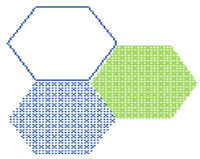
