

National Youth Week Grants

- Funding to run activities and events during National Youth Week (10 to 19 April 2015) with the theme of 'It Starts With You'
- Available for government, non-government, and local council organisations working directly with young people
- Up to \$2,000 for individual organisations and up to \$4,000 for collaborative activities involving two or more organisations

National Youth Week Grants examples

- Battle of the Bands
- Skateboard and BMX comps and displays
- Colour dash and dances
- Short film competitions
- Pamper days and Gym sessions
- Workshops learning a new skill(s) or consulting young people for their opinion.
- Youth forums

- Day events involving sporting activities and special guests
- Laser skirmish/paint ball
- Music workshops and events
- Artistic/ creative workshops, competitions and exhibitions including digital art
- Youth Recognition Awards
- Festivals and Expos
- Cultural events

Youth Volunteer Scholarships

- One-off grants up to \$3,000
- For young South Australians, aged 25 years and under, who volunteer to help in the community.
- \$25,000 is available for grants each year
- For assistance with tuition fees
- Average grant size is \$1,000
- Applications open in mid 2015

Volunteer Support Fund

- One-off grants up to \$3,000
- Programs and equipment
- \$150,000 is available for grants each year
- Average grant size is \$1,500
- Opens for applications in August each year
- Phone 1300 014 712

Volunteer Support Fund examples

- An animal rescue organisation purchased equipment for the 'Desex and Return to Home' program
- A charity club delivered training to volunteers to become volunteer mentors for young people
- A CFS branch purchased reversing cameras for trucks and buses driven by volunteers
- An organisation provided First Aid training & digital computer training software for volunteers

Volunteer Training Grants

- To deliver free training courses for volunteers and volunteer managers
- \$100,000 is available in training grants this year
- Grants of up to \$10,000 for eligible South Australian organisations e.g. volunteer resource centers, councils, training providers and not-for-profit incorporated community organisations.
- Applications will open in February 2015

Multicultural Grants

- One-off grants up to \$15,000
- Programs, events, equipment
- \$650,000 is available in grants each year
- Average grant size is between \$2,000 \$4,000
- Apply anytime, no closing date
- Applications up to 8 -10 weeks to assess
- Phone 1300 239 468

Multicultural Grant examples:

A Historical Society received \$3,000 funds to print a multi-national centenary cookbook with recipes collected from community members.

A Community Centre received \$1,000 for an event on which included multicultural performances, food, and cooking demonstrations.

A regional community board received \$5,000 toward the cost of a multicultural performer travelling to a festival.

A community association received \$750 for a barbeque.

Community Benefit SA

- One-off projects up to \$50,000
- Facilities, equipment and programs
- \$3.8m available for grants each year
- Average grant size is \$15,000
- Apply anytime, no closing date
- Applications take 12 weeks to assess

Assessment Process

- Application is complete
- Applicant is eligible
- Documentation is provided
- Funder's purpose is matched
- Specific grants specific assessment criteria
